Patient safety means being diligent 365 days a year. So remember:

- Clean hands are the single most important factor in preventing the spread of pathogens.
- Hand hygiene reduces the incidence of health care associated infections.
- When your hands are visibly dirty, contaminated or soiled, wash with antimicrobial soap and water.
- If your hands are not visibly soiled, use an alcohol-based handrub for the routine decontamination of your hands.
- To prevent the spread of Clostridium difficile, wear gloves.
