






## Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs and Risk Assessment



#### Measure 1.1: Decrease opioid related overdose deaths by 7%



A Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) is an electronic database that tracks controlled substance prescriptions in a state.

#### PDMP



#### Highlights

- Dispensers must submit data
- Dispensed controlled substances reported on at least a daily basis
- Providers and pharmacists can:
  - Access PDMP patient reports
  - Authorize delegates (designees)
- Patient safety tool

#### **Functionality**

- Delegate management
- Enhanced reporting
- Share PDMP data with other states
- Clinical workflow integration




# What needs to be reported to the PDMP?

- Patient: name, address, gender, DOB, phone, identifier
- Pharmacy: name, address, DEA/NPI
- Prescription: date issued, date filled, name of drug (NDC), strength, quantity, payment type
- Prescriber: name, DEA/NPI









#### Leaving in Action




Improving the way opioids are prescribed will ensure patients have access to safer, more effective chronic pain treatment while reducing opioid misuse, abuse, and overdose. Checking your state's PDMP is an important step in safer prescribing of these drugs.

#### WHEN SHOULD I CHECK THE PDMP?

State requirements
vary, but CDC
recommends
checking at
least once every
3 months and
consider checking
prior to every
opioid prescription.



#### WHAT SHOULD I CONSIDER WHEN PRESCRIBING OPIOIDS?



Talk to your patient about the risks for respiratory depression and overdose. Consider offering to taper opioids as well as prescribing naloxone for patients taking 50 MME/day or more.

Counsel your patient and coordinate care with their other prescribers to improve safety and discuss the need to obtain opioids from a single provider. Check the PDMP regularly and consider tapering or discontinuation of opioids if pattern continues. Whenever possible, avoid prescribing opioids and benzodiazepines concurrently. Communicate with other prescribers to prioritize patient goals and weigh risks of concurrent opioid and benzodiazepine use.
