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COVID-19 Vaccine Update

Previous Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommendations ensured that people who are immunocompromised were already eligible for additional doses of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Updated Recommendation Summary:

Persons 65 Years Old and Older - NOT Moderately or Severely Immunocompromised

People ages 65 years old and older should receive one additional dose of any updated (2023–2024 formula) COVID-19 vaccine (i.e., Moderna, Novavax, Pfizer-BioNTech) at least four months following the previous dose of updated (2023–2024 formula) COVID-19 vaccine.

Note: For initial vaccination with Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine, the two-dose series should be completed before administration of the additional dose.

COVID-19 Vaccine Update, (continued)

Persons 65 Years Old and Older - Moderately or Severely Immunocompromised (no changes)

People ages 65 years old and older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised should receive one additional dose of any updated (2023–2024 formula) COVID-19 vaccine (i.e., Moderna, Novavax, Pfizer-BioNTech) at least two months after the last dose of updated (2023–2024 formula) vaccine. Further additional doses may be administered, informed by the clinical judgement of a health care provider and personal preference and circumstances. Any further additional doses should be administered at least two months after the last updated (2023–2024 formula) COVID-19 vaccine dose.





Weekly COVID-19 Snapshot





- Provides a turnkey resource for education


Step One: Program Postcards Sent in Mail



Every nursing facility was mailed program postcards with a QR code at the end of February.

These postcards were addressed to the administrator.

Step Two: Program Flyer is Distributed



Who Can Distribute the Postcard?



- Anyone
- Marketing personnel can distribute the program
- Program postcard can be handed out to families/staff
- Activities director can incorporate
- Staff in-service
- Limitless distribution options

Step Three: Scan the QR code




Each participant should register, scan the QR code and complete the program.

- The Sepsis Prevention Program takes less than 20 minutes to complete.
- The Combined Vaccine Program takes less than 10 minutes to complete.

- Each person registers/signs in for program
- Personal information is only used to help participant if there is a technical issue
- Personal information **not** utilized for any other reason by Viven Health or Mountain Pacific
